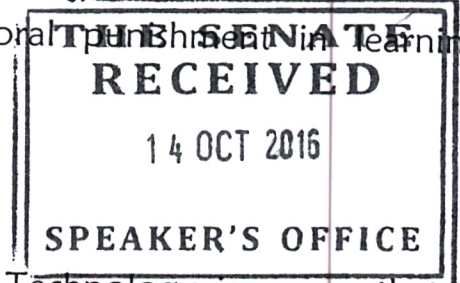




REQUEST FOR STATEMENT BY SEN. CATHERINE MUKIITE, NOMINATED SENATOR

Mr. Speaker Sir,

Pursuant to Standing Order 45 (2) (b), I rise to seek a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Education regarding corporal punishment in learning institutions.



In the Statement, the Chairperson should explain-

1. whether the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology is aware that a teacher injured a student at Nyabururu Girls High School in Kisii County while the teacher was administering corporal punishment on the pupil last week;
2. whether or not disciplinary measures have been taken on the teacher by the Ministry considering that corporal in schools is outlawed;
3. what the Ministry has done to sensitize teachers against the use of corporal punishment in schools; and
4. whether there are mechanisms the Ministry has put in place to monitor cases of corporal punishment in schools and ensure they are reported and appropriate action taken.

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REQUEST FOR A STATEMENT FROM THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION, INFORMATION AND TECHNOLOGY REGARDING CORPORAL PUNISHMENT IN LEARNING INSTITUTIONS.

Pursuant to standing order no.45b, I wish to request a statement from the chair committee on education, information and technology concerning the incidence at Nyabururu Girls' in Kisii County where a teacher injured a student in the course of administering corporal punishment. Corporal punishment is banned in Kenya with the country having a code for discipline of students in school under the education Act, 1980.

Therefore in the statement the chair should;

- a. State disciplinary measures that have been undertaken by the ministry to ensure that corporal punishment is not used by teachers as a means of instilling discipline as prescribed by the Education Act.
- b. Explain what the ministry has done to ensure that teachers are sensitized on the use of corporal punishment in schools
- c. State what the ministry has done to ensure that such incidences are monitored and reported to the ministry for appropriate action since most schools still use corporal punishment to discipline students

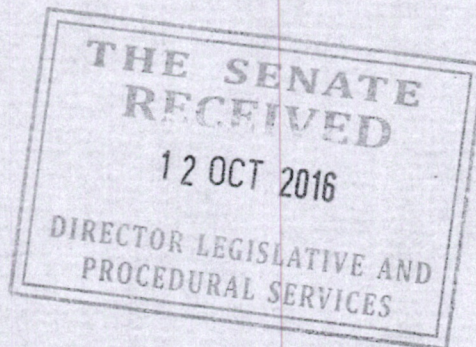

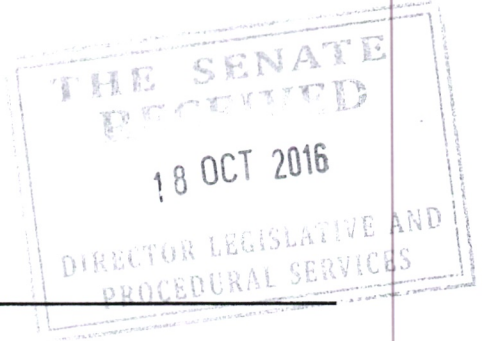

REQUEST FOR A STATEMENT ON THE BOUNDARIES IN MALEWA WEST WARD OF GILGIL CONSTITUENCY

Mr. Speaker Sir, I rise pursuant to Standing Order 45 (2) (b), to seek a Statement from Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Legal Affairs and Human Rights regarding the mislay of residents of Kasarani in Malewa West Ward in Gilgil Constituency who are classified as residents of Naivasha and Gilgil Constituency, *in Nakuru County.*

In the Statement, The Chairperson should state:

- a) Whether ⁺The Government is aware that the residents of Malewa West Ward in Gilgil Constituency are classified as Naivasha residents yet the ward is in Gilgil Constituency;
- b) Whether ⁺The Government is aware of the lost opportunities the residents of this area have endured in the Government recruitment drives for National Police Service, National Youth Service and Kenya Defence Forces, etc. where mobilization is on Constituency basis and they are literally chased away from Gilgil, told to go to Naivasha where they are also chased away back to Gilgil;
- c) The steps the Government will take to rectify this anomaly and ensure that the residents get their rightful share of opportunities.
