## CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

Kibwezi East Constituency is an electoral constituency in Makueni County, Kenya and comprises of the following wards: Masongaleni Ward, Mtito Andei Ward, Thange Ward, Ivingoni/Nzambani Ward. The current Member of Parliament is Hon. Jessica Mbalu, MP, CBS.<sup>i</sup>

The Petition by Hon. Jessicah Mbalu, MP regarding Human-Wildlife Conflict in Kibwezi East Constituency was tabled in the House on 24<sup>th</sup> July 2019, pursuant to Article 119 (1) of the Constitution and Standing Order No. 225 (2) (a). The House, pursuant to Standing Order 227, referred the petition to the Departmental Committee on Environment & Natural Resources for consideration. The Committee then set out a procedure for its consideration and to report to the House as set out in Standing Order No 227(2).

In considering the Petition, the Committee held a meeting with the Principal Secretary, Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife and the Hon. Jessicah Mbalu, MP on behalf of the petitioners to deliberate on the contents of the petition.

The Committee, having reviewed the evidence submitted to it by the stakeholders, made a number of observations. First, the term of the previous Makueni County Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committee had lapsed and a new Committee had just been gazetted. With the transition period, HWC compensation claims vetting had stalled. Second, there was need to erect electric fences in hot spot areas which were to be identified in conjunction with the area MP, to curb the movement of animals into human settlements and thus avoid HWC. Third, there was fencing exercise that was on-going on the Chyulu Hills National Park side which needed to be expedited. Fourth, there was need to provide water pans in the parks to discourage animals from venturing out of the parks in search of the same. Fifth, there was need to expedite the ongoing rehabilitation of road network around the affected areas to facilitate expeditious response by the KWS rangers whenever an attack is reported. Finally, there was need for the KWS to put up more outposts and increase the number of staff to ensure effective response to animal attacks.

The Committee then made the following recommendations:

1. The KWS should:
  - a) expedite the compensation of the 27 cases (in appendix 1) that had been approved by the Ministerial Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committee.
  - b) in conjunction with the area Member of the National Assembly, help the local community to develop proposals on the fencing of particular schools in the area for consideration for funding by KWS Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) program.
  - c) expedite the rehabilitation of the fence along the area of Tsavo West National Park bordering the community areas of Mtito Andei, Mang'elele and Bondeni within the current financial year (2019/2020 FY).
  - d) fast-track public participation and stakeholders'/community consultative forums in order to ensure timely implementation of the planned fencing of Chyulu National Park.
  - e) provide water pans/watering points in the Tsavo East National Park and Chyulu Hills National Park, especially area bordering human settlements, to discourage

animals from venturing out of the parks in search of the same. This should be prioritized in the Budget for FY 2020/2021.

- f) expedite the ongoing rehabilitation of road network around the affected areas to facilitate expeditious response by the KWS rangers whenever an attack was reported.
  - g) in conjunction with the area Member of the National Assembly, identify priority hot spot areas and take appropriate action, erect more outposts in the Constituency and increase the number of staff to ensure effective response to animal attacks.
2. The Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife should facilitate the newly appointed Makueni County Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committee to expeditiously consider the 131 pending cases (in appendix 2) which are awaiting deliberation by the County Wildlife Conservation Committee.

## **1.0 PREFACE**

## 2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 6) Kenya, like many other countries, is experiencing fast human population growth and the associated demand for more space for agriculture, human settlements, and other developments. Human population increase is accompanied with progressive habitat fragmentation and demand for space as people seek alternative livelihoods.
- 7) The Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS), created in 1989, has the mandate of overseeing wildlife conservation in all protected and non-protected areas in Kenya, including wildlife parks, reserves, sanctuaries, and community conservancies. Wildlife in Kenya faces many threats including poaching, habitat loss, competition for water and food with livestock and human-Wildlife Conflicts (Hwc). KWS has been collecting data on HWC since the early 1990s for some of the areas under its jurisdiction, such as the Tsavo and Maasai Mara (Mara) regions. These two regions support most of the wildlife in Kenya.
- 8) Human-Wildlife Conflicts (HWC) has remained a persistent problem and a major threat to wildlife conservation and management efforts in Kenya. The conflicts have become severe over recent decades as a result of: land use changes (agriculture and settlements), human population growth, climatic changes, competition for resources, high wildlife population in some areas, blockage of wildlife migratory corridors and dispersal areas, habitat loss, degradation and fragmentation, changing perceptions by some communities living with wildlife.ii
- 9) HWC are currently ranked amongst the main threats to wildlife conservation in Kenya. The conflicts manifest in the form of: human and wildlife deaths, injuries, crop damage, property destruction (fences, water tanks, granaries, water pans, fish pond), and livestock predation. These conflicts impose major economic and human costs on local communities in many parts of this country, particularly around protected areas and other non-protected wildlife rangelands. If left unaddressed, these conflicts may have long-term negative implications on socio-economic developments across the Country.iii
- 10) Kibwezi East Constituency is an electoral constituency in Makueni County, Kenya and comprises of the following wards: Masongaleni Ward, Mtito Andei Ward, Thange Ward, Ivingoni/Nzambani Ward. The current Member of Parliament is Hon. Jessica Mbalu, MP.iv
- 11) The Petition by Hon. Jessicah Mbalu, MP regarding Human-Wildlife Conflict in Kibwezi East Constituency was tabled in the House on 24th July 2019, pursuant to Article 119 (1) of the Constitution and Standing Order No. 225 (2) (a). The House, pursuant to Standing Order 227, referred the petition to the Departmental Committee on Environment & Natural Resources for consideration. The Committee then set out a procedure for its consideration and to report to the House as set out in Standing Order No 227(2).
- 12) In considering the Petition, the Committee held a meeting with the Principal Secretary, Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife and the Hon. Jessicah Mbalu, MP on behalf of the petitioners to deliberate on the contents of the petition.

### **3.0 SUBMISSIONS BY THE STAKEHOLDERS**

13) The Committee engaged the following stakeholders on the petition regarding Human-Wildlife Conflict in Kibwezi East Constituency: the petitioners, represented by the Hon. Jessicah Mbalu, MP, CBS and the Principal Secretary, Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife. Their submissions are recorded hereunder:

#### **3.1 Submission by the Petitioners through the Hon. Jessicah Mbalu, MP**

14) The Hon. Jessicah Mbalu, MP Kibwezi East Constituency appeared before the Committee on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2019 and made submissions on the matter.

15) The Hon. Member stated that the fourth schedule of the Constitution assigns the National Government the responsibility of protection of the environment and natural resources. She further stated that residents of Masongaleni, Thange, Mtito Andei and Ivingoni-Nzambani Wards in Kibwezi East Constituency had experienced increasing attacks by elephants resulting in loss of lives and livestock and destruction of crops and property.

16) She equally pointed out that numerous cases of HWC had been reported to authorities and claims for compensation lodged in vain and that most parts of the constituency, including schools, bordering National Parks remained unfenced making it easy for animals to stray out. This had led to learning being paralyzed in most schools bordering the National Parks at times for several weeks due to attacks by especially elephants.

17) The Member further stated that KWS wardens were clearly overwhelmed, resulting in delay in responding to distress calls from residents. This had forced the residents to resolve the matter through demonstrations against the inaction by the KWS, which had borne no results.

18) She then stated that her prayers, on behalf of the petitioners, were that the National Assembly through the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources:

- a) Intervenes with a view to ensuring that Kenya Wildlife Service expeditiously compensates victims and affected families for loss of lives and destruction of property caused;
- b) Recommends that the Kenya Wildlife Service erects an electric fence at all areas with schools in Masongaleni, Mtito Andei, Thange and Ivingoni-Nzambani wards of Kibwezi East Constituency; Bordering Tsavo East National park, Tsavo West National Park and Chyulu hills National park to mitigate the conflict;
- c) Engages the KWS to ensure that perimeter fences are erected along the unfenced parts of Tsavo East park bordering Kibwezi East Constituency and Chyulu Hills National Park to ward off elephants and other animals that stray to human settlements; and,
- d) Intervenes through the relevant Ministry to facilitate the Kenya Wildlife Service to increase the number of posts or camps in the area for efficient surveillance and quick response to distress calls whenever elephants and other wild animals stray to human settlements.



### 3.2 Submission by the Principal Secretary Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife

- 19) Prof. Fred Segor, Principal Secretary, Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife appeared before the Committee on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> September, 2019 and made his submissions on the matter.
- 20) On the prayer regarding ensuring that Kenya Wildlife Service expeditiously compensates victims and affected families for loss of lives and destruction of property caused, he stated that the following was the status of HWC claims from Makueni County, where Kibwezi East Constituency is located covering the period 2014 to May 2017.

- 21) He also provided two tables that had details on the HWC incidences in Kibwezi East Constituency and the actions taken (Appendix 1 and Appendix 2). Table 1 provides a summary of human-wildlife conflict incidences from Kibwezi East Constituency. The conflict claims have been deliberated by the County Wildlife Conservation Committee and were submitted to the Cabinet Secretary for examination and considerations. On the other hand, Table 2 provides the status HWC incidences from Kibwezi East Constituency, which are awaiting deliberation by the County Wildlife Conservation Committee.
- 22) On the prayer regarding the Committee recommending that the Kenya Wildlife Service erects an electric fence at all areas with schools in Masongaleni, Mtito Andei, Thange and Ivingoni-Nzambani wards of Kibwezi East Constituency; Bordering Tsavo East National Park, Tsavo West National Park and Chyulu National Park to mitigate the conflict, he stated that the community living adjacent to Tsavo East National Park benefitted from projects funded by KWS under its Corporate Social Responsibility program. They were funded based on proposals submitted by the community through the area Community Warden. He further pointed out that the constituents needed to develop proposals in line with the fencing of the particular schools in question for consideration for funding by KWS CSR program.



- 23) On the prayer regarding the Committee engaging KWS to ensure that perimeter fences were erected along the unfenced parts of Tsavo East park bordering Kibwezi East Constituency and Chyulu Hills National Park to ward off elephants and other animals that stray to human settlements, he stated that the area of Tsavo West National Park bordering the community areas of Mtito Andei, Mang'etele and Bondeni had a perimeter electric fence of 20.30km of 6-strands that was constructed in 2002/2006 as a human wildlife mitigation measure. This fence had been considered for rehabilitation within the current financial year (2019/2020 FY) to enhance efficiency.
- 24) He further elaborated that fencing of Chyulu National Park was expected to commence as soon as public participation and stakeholders/community consultative forums were undertaken. The fence would be erected in collaboration with one of the KWS partners, the David Sheldrick Foundation. Further the PS indicated that Problem Animal Control hotspots were identified from time to time and given priority attention including intensified driving of animals further inside the park, as well as capturing and translocation of problem animals.
- 25) On the prayer regarding the Committee intervening through the relevant Ministry to facilitate the Kenya Wildlife Service to increase the number of posts or camps in the area for efficient surveillance and quick response to distress calls whenever elephants and other wild animals stray to human settlements, he stated that a new outpost had been established at Katulye Village in Masongaleni area. This outpost has a mobile HWC response team that ensures swift response to any wildlife straying from Tsavo East National Park into the community areas.

#### 4.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

- 26) Having reviewed the evidence submitted to it by the stakeholders', the Committee observed as follows. First, the term of the previous Makueni County Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committee had lapsed and a new Committee had just been gazetted. With the transition period, HWC compensation claims vetting had stalled.
- 27) There was need to erect electric fences in hot spot areas and the identification of the areas would be done in conjunction with the area MP. This would assist to curb the movement of animals into human settlements and thus avoid HWC.
- 28) There was fencing on going on the Chyulu Hills National Park side but observed that the same ought to be expedited.
- 29) There was need to provide water pans in the parks to discourage animals from venturing out of the parks in search of the same.
- 30) There was need to expedite the ongoing rehabilitation of road network around the affected areas to facilitate expeditious response by the KWS rangers whenever an attack is reported.
- 31) There was need for the KWS to put up more outposts and increase the number of staff to ensure effective response to animal attacks.



## 5.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

32) The Committee makes the following recommendations:

33) **Prayer One:** The National Assembly, through the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural resources intervenes with a view to ensuring that Kenya Wildlife Service expeditiously compensates victims and affected families for loss of lives and destruction of property caused.

### **Recommendations:**

- a) The KWS should expedite the compensation of the 27 cases (in appendix 1) that had been approved by the Ministerial Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committee (MWCCC).
- b) The Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife should facilitate the just gazette Makueni County Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committee to expeditiously consider the 131 pending cases (in appendix 2) which are awaiting deliberation by the County Wildlife Conservation Committee.

34) **Prayer Two:** The National Assembly, through the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural resources recommends that the Kenya Wildlife Service erects an electric fence at all areas with schools in Masongaleni, Mtito Andei, Thange and Ivingoni-Nzambani wards of Kibwezi East Constituency; Bordering Tsavo East National park, Tsavo West National Park and Chyulu hills National park to mitigate the conflict.

### **Recommendation:**

The KWS should, in conjunction with the area Member of the National Assembly, assist the local community to develop proposals on the fencing of particular schools in the area for consideration for funding by KWS CSR program.

35) **Prayer Three:** The National Assembly, through the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural resources engages the KWS to ensure that perimeter fences are erected along the unfenced parts of Tsavo East park bordering Kibwezi East Constituency and Chyulu Hills National Park to ward off elephants and other animals that stray to human settlements.

### **Recommendations:**

- a) The KWS should expedite the rehabilitation of the fence along the area of Tsavo West National Park bordering the community areas of Mtito Andei, Mang'etele and Bondeni within the current financial year (2019/2020 FY).
- b) The KWS should fast-track public participation and stakeholders'/community consultative forums in order to ensure timely implementation of the planned fencing of Chyulu National Park.

- c) The KWS should provide water pans/watering points in the Tsavo East National Park and Chyulu Hills National Park, especially area bordering human settlements, to discourage animals from venturing out of the parks in search of the same.
- d) The KWS should expedite the ongoing rehabilitation of road network around the affected areas to facilitate expeditious response by the KWS rangers whenever an attack was reported.

36) **Prayer Four:** The National Assembly, through the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural resources intervenes through the relevant Ministry to facilitate the Kenya Wildlife Service to increase the number of posts or camps in the area for efficient surveillance and quick response to distress calls whenever elephants and other wild animals stray to human settlements.

**Recommendation:**

The KWS should, in conjunction with the area Member of the National Assembly, identify priority hot spot areas for action to be taken, erect more outposts and increase the number of staff to ensure effective response to animal attacks.

The Members adopted the Agenda of the meeting.

### **MIN.NO.DC/ENR/398/2019:** - **CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES**

Confirmation of minutes of the previous meeting was deferred to a later date.

### **MIN.NO. DC/ENR/399/2019:** - **CONSIDERATION AND ADOPTION OF A REPORT ON A PETITION REGARDING HUMAN-WILDLIFE CONFLICT IN KIBWEZI EAST CONSTITUENCY**

The report on a petition regarding human-wildlife conflict in Kibwezi East Constituency was considered and adopted after being proposed and seconded by Hon. Hassan Oda Hulufu, M.P and Hon. Nasri Sahal Ibrahim, M.P. respectively. It was adopted with the following recommendations:

- 1) **Prayer One:** The National Assembly, through the departmental Committee on Environment and Natural resources intervenes with a view to ensuring that Kenya Wildlife Service expeditiously compensates victims and affected families for loss of lives and destruction of property caused.

**Recommendations:**

- a) The KWS should expedite the compensation of the 27 cases (in appendix 1) that had been approved by the Ministerial Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committee (MWCCC).
  - b) The Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife should facilitate the just gazette Makueni County Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committee to expeditiously consider the 131 pending cases (in appendix 2) which are awaiting deliberation by the County Wildlife Conservation Committee.
- 2) **Prayer Two:** The National Assembly, through the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural resources recommends that the Kenya Wildlife Service erects an electric fence at all areas with schools in Masongaleni, Mtito Andei, Thange and Ivingoni-Nzambani wards of Kibwezi East Constituency; Bordering Tsavo East National park, Tsavo West National Park and Chyulu hills National park to mitigate the conflict.

**Recommendation:**

The KWS should, in conjunction with the area Member of the National Assembly, assist the local community to develop proposals on the fencing of particular schools in the area for consideration for funding by KWS CSR program.

- 3) **Prayer Three:** The National Assembly, through the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural resources engages the KWS to ensure that perimeter fences are erected along the unfenced parts of Tsavo East park bordering Kibwezi East Constituency and Chyulu Hills National Park to ward off elephants and other animals that stray to human settlements.

**Recommendations:**

- a) The KWS should expedite the rehabilitation of the fence along the area of Tsavo West National Park bordering the community areas of Mtito Andei, Mang'elele and Bondeni within the current financial year (2019/2020 FY).
- b) The KWS should fast-track public participation and stakeholders'/community consultative forums in order to ensure timely implementation of the planned fencing of Chyulu National Park.
- c) The KWS should provide water pans/watering points in the Tsavo East National Park and Chyulu Hills National Park, especially area bordering human settlements, to discourage animals from venturing out of the parks in search of the same.



- d) The KWS should expedite the ongoing rehabilitation of road network around the affected areas to facilitate expeditious response by the KWS rangers whenever an attack was reported.
- 4) **Prayer Four:** The National Assembly, through the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural resources intervenes through the relevant Ministry to facilitate the Kenya Wildlife Service to increase the number of posts or camps in the area for efficient surveillance and quick response to distress calls whenever elephants and other wild animals stray to human settlements.

**Recommendation:**

The KWS should, in conjunction with the area Member of the National Assembly, identify priority hot spot areas for action to be taken, erect more outposts and increase the number of staff to ensure effective response to animal attacks.

**MIN.NO. DC/ENR/400/2019:**

- **MEETING WITH THE HON. CHARLES GIMOSE, MP REGARDING A PETITION ON SETTLEMENT AND COMPENSATION OF FAMILIES DISPOSED OF LAND IN VIHIGA COUNTY.**

The Hon. Charles Gimose, MP appeared before the Committee and briefed it that:

1. Over 800 families were forcibly evicted from Vihiga, Sabatia, and Hamisi sub counties in Vihiga County and settled in Kipiri Forest in 1985 to pave way for the construction of present day Vihiga County Headquarters, Vihiga County Hospital, Vihiga County Prison, Vihiga Regional Police Headquarters, Mbale Police Station, Moi Girls Vokoli Secondary School, Mudete Tea Factory, Sabatia Hospital, and other office complex for public utility.
2. The resettlement also affected members of the Tiriki community who were living adjacent to schools and other government facilities.
3. The displaced families relocated to Musunji Village in Hamisi Sub-County which was part of Kipiri Forest, part of Kakamega Forest Reserve. Each family was then promised compensation of twice the size of land it held in Mbale Village as well as financial compensation arising out of compulsory acquisition of their land.
4. Authorities undertook to degazette the land set aside from the forest area, conduct survey and issue title deeds to the relocated families who settled in Kipiri Forest as directed, started subsistence farming, built homes and planted trees.

5. Failure by authorities to compensate families, conduct survey and issue title deeds as promised had led to constant harassment of families that are adjacent to Kakamega Forest Reserve by forest officers who treat the relocated families as squatters and illegal settlers.
6. Government agencies had set up electricity poles and transformers without seeking wayleave from the families settled in the area under the pretext that the relocated households didn't have titles to the land they occupy.
7. KWS and KFS are currently erecting a fence which will eventually lock out the relocated families from the land they are settled on.
8. The families live under constant harassment from government operatives with threats of eviction.
9. Efforts to resolve the matter by locals through letters to the provincial administration and ministry of lands hadn't borne fruit.
10. The petitioners prayed that the National Assembly through the Committee:
  - a) Enquires into the relocation of the affected families from Maragoli and Hamisi Sub-Counties in Vihiga County with a view to facilitating the degazettement of the occupied areas expropriated from Kipiri Forest and the larger Kakamega Forest Reserve, the surveying of the area and issuance of title deeds, compensation for the compulsory acquisition of private property, establishment of a settlement scheme in the occupied area having requisite amenities and establishment of a buffer one having a police station to boost security in the area.
  - b) Makes any other recommendations it deems appropriate in the circumstances of the case.

**MIN.NO. DC/ENR/401/2019:**

- **OBSERVATIONS AND RESOLUTIONS**

### **OBSERVATIONS**

1. The settlers were being harassed by security agencies and other government operatives and there was need to restore sanity in the area.
2. It was not clear whether the petitioners had any documentation on the relocation process i.e. the initiation, the execution and the promises made to them.
3. There was need for the petitioners to develop a comprehensive list of the people or households affected by the matter.
4. There were public facilities in the area like schools, electricity supply, playgrounds, and land earmarked for a hospital.

**RESOLUTIONS**

It was resolved that:

1. The legal counsel attached to the committee to prepare a brief to the Committee on the process of compulsory acquisition of land and indicate if the process was adhered to in the circumstances elaborated on in the petition.
2. The petitioner to provide documentation/evidence of the said evictions, resettlement and promises made to the affected families.

## **MIN.NO. DC/ENR/358/2019: - MEETING WITH THE CABINET SECRETARY FOR TOURISM AND WILDLIFE REGARDING A QUESTION ASKED BY HON. SIMON KINGARA.**

**Hon. Simon Kingara posed his question as follows:**

- a) What action is the Ministry taking to contain hippopotamus and other wild animals along the rivers and streams that are causing deaths and injuries to residents and livestock and destruction of crops in Muchana Estate in Ruiru Constituency?
- b) What plans has the Ministry put in place to ensure the victims and affected families of human-wildlife conflict are compensated for the loss of life, crops or livestock in Ruiru constituency?

**Prof. Fred Segor, Principal Secretary, Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife appeared before the Committee and briefed it that:**

1. The following were the actions taken by the Ministry through KWS in response to conflicts caused by hippos:
  - a) Continuous community engagement to educate and create awareness on human-wildlife co-existence (meetings, barazas, seminars and workshops). Muchana Estate and its environs was singled out during the development of the neighboring Tatu City open area integrated wildlife management plan of 2012-2017, and a series of awareness creation forums were conducted (Table 3). The community was sensitized on matters of hippopotamus, leopards and other species.
  - b) Capture and translocation - Two hippos were captured and translocated from the Constituency to Nairobi National Park in July 2019. Assessments are ongoing to determine the remaining population and to identify the inhabited dams.
  - c) Ranger post Established - Due to increasing reports from the area, an additional patrol base has been established at Juja and provided with a motorbike that has reduced the time taken to respond to conflicts.

## **OBSERVATIONS**

Members observed that:

1. Ruiru town, an industrial centre, was highly polluted. However, the locals worked around the clock hence need to deal with the human-wildlife conflict in the area decisively to enable thriving of businesses in the area.
2. The hippos that were the major cause of the human-wildlife conflict in the area were still in the vicinity and there was need to have them removed since they were near human habitats which fueled the frequent conflicts.
3. Mr. Willy Kariuki Kibe, who had been attacked and injured by the animals had succumbed to the injuries and had been buried on 19<sup>th</sup> July, 2019.

## **RESOLUTIONS**

It was resolved that:

1. On the removal of hippos from Ruiru Centre, it was agreed that the Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife to assess the situation in the area and chart the way forward. It shall then report to the committee on the way forward within 60 days from the date of the meeting.
2. The area MP, the Hon. Simon Kingara to help the locals who had suffered attacks from the animals to lodge compensation claims with the KWS.

Prof. Fred Segor, Principal Secretary, Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife appeared before the Committee and briefed it that:

1. On the Committee intervening with a view to ensuring that Kenya Wildlife Service expeditiously compensates victims and affected families for loss of lives and destruction of property caused; he stated that the following was the status of HWC claims from Makueni County, where Kibwezi East Constituency is located covering the period 2014 to May 2017).

2. On the Committee recommending that the Kenya Wildlife Service erects an electric fence at all areas with schools in Masongaleni , Mtito Andei, Thange and Ivingoni-Nzambani wards of Kibwezi East Constituency; Bordering Tsavo East National Park, Tsavo West National Park and Chyulu National Park to mitigate the conflict; he stated that:
  - a) The community living adjacent to Tsavo East National Park benefits from projects funded by KWS under the Corporate Social Responsibility program. They are funded based on proposals submitted by the community through the area Community Warden.
  - b) The constituents ought to develop proposals in line with the fencing of the particular schools in question for consideration for funding by KWS CSR program.
3. On the Committee engaging KWS to ensure that perimeter fences are erected along the unfenced parts of Tsavo East park bordering Kibwezi East Constituency and Chyulu Hills National Park to ward off elephants and other animals that stray to human settlements; he stated that
  - a) The area of Tsavo West National Park bordering the community areas of Mtito Andei, Mang'etele and Bondeni has a perimeter electric fence of 20.30km of 6-strands that was constructed in 2002/2006 as a human wildlife mitigation measure. This fence had been considered for rehabilitation within the current financial year to enhance efficiency.
  - b) Fencing of Chyulu National park was expected to commence as soon as public participation and stakeholders/community consultative forums are undertaken. This fence is being built in collaboration with one of our partners, the David Sheldrick Foundation.
  - c) Problem animal control hotspots were identified from time to time and given priority attention including intensified driving of animals further inside the park, while capture and translocation of problem animals is also undertaken.

4. On the Committee intervening through the relevant ministry to facilitate the Kenya wildlife Service to increase the number of posts or camps in the area for efficient surveillance and quick response to distress calls whenever elephants and other wild animals stray to human settlements he stated that a new outpost had been established at Katulye village in Masongaleni area. This outpost has a mobile HWC response team that ensures swift response to any wildlife straying from Tsavo East National Park into the community areas.

**- OBSERVATIONS/RESOLUTIONS**

**OBSERVATIONS**

It was observed that:

1. The term of the Makueni County Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committee had lapsed and no committee was in place. This had stalled any lodging of compensation claims.
2. There was need to erect electric fences in priority areas (to be identified in conjunction with the area MP) to curb the movement of animals into human settlements.
3. There was need to provide water pans in the parks to discourage animals from venturing out of the parks in search of the same.
4. There was fencing on going on the Chyulu Hills National Park side but it needed to be expedited.
5. There was need to expedite the ongoing rehabilitation of road network around the affected areas to facilitate expeditious response by the KWS rangers whenever an attack is reported.
6. There was need for the KWS to put up more outposts and increase the number of staff to ensure effective response to animal attacks.

**RESOLUTIONS**

It was resolved that:

1. The ministry of tourism and wildlife shall prepare a detailed report focusing on Kibwezi East Constituency not the entire Makueni County and submit to the committee within 2 weeks from the date of the meeting. The said report should capture the most recent incidents in the area.
2. The committee shall seek the permission of the House to extend the period of consideration of the petition to allow the ministry to file a focused and updated report on the matter.

### **MIN.NO. DC/ENR/350/2019: - PRELIMINARIES**

The meeting was called to order at 11.36 a.m. after which prayers were said. The Chairperson then stated that the main agenda of the meeting was:

- a) Meeting with the Cabinet Secretary for Environment and Forestry to respond to a question asked by Hon. Muturi Kigano, MP.
- b) Meeting with Hon. Jessicah Mbalu, CBS, MP regarding a Petition on Human Wildlife Conflict in Kibwezi East Constituency.

The Members adopted the Agenda of the meeting.

### **MIN.NO.DC/ENR/351/2019: - CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES**

Confirmation of the minutes of the previous sitting was deferred to the next sitting.

### **MIN.NO. DC/ENR/352/2019: - MEETING WITH THE CABINET SECRETARY FOR ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTRY TO RESPOND TO QUESTION 327/2019 ASKED BY HON. MUTURI KIGANO, MP.**

**MUTURI**

**The question was posed as follows:**

- a) What steps has the Ministry taken to implement environmental policies as outlined in the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands and Waterfowl Habitats, ratified by Kenya I 1990, to promote the conservation of wetlands?
- b) Why has the National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA) continued to allow the intrusion and destruction of wetlands in the Country through indiscriminate infills, construction and establishments of structures on water springs and riparian lands, such as land between Kanyagia and Kiambu Roads, land in Embulbul-Ngong Township area, Kigwa springs, land near the Northern bypass flyover, as well as the wetlands at Mjini Stream that runs parallel to Murang'a Road in Murang'a Town?
- c) What action is the Ministry taking to reclaim wet and riparian lands and protect them from further encroachments?

**Hon Mohamed Elmi, Administrative Secretary, Ministry of Environment and Forestry, appeared before the Committee and briefed it that:**

1. On the steps taken by the Ministry to implement Environmental Policies as outlined in the Ramsar convention on Wetlands and waterfowl Habitats, ratified by Kenya in 1990, to promote the conservation of wetlands he stated that:
  - a) The Ministry through NEMA had developed and put in place a robust wetland policy for the entire Country, from which appropriate relevant interventions and mitigations are derived and implemented by all the institutions concerned in wetlands protection under their respective jurisdictions. The Ministry had also generated a National Action Plan for Wetland conservation, preservation and protection all over the Country and; accordingly generated National Implementation Strategies for the Action Plan.
  - b) The Ministry, on behalf of the Government of Kenya, had developed comprehensive wetland regulations to inventorize all wetlands in the Country, preserve, conserve and protect them for public interest, in line with Section 42 and Section 55 of EMCA 1999. In this regard, the Ministry had generated Wetlands Alta for the Country. It had put in place a strong and robust monitoring system to mitigate related impacts on wetlands.
  - c) The Ministry through NEMA prepared management plans for all the six Ramsar sites in Kenya. These Management plans are updated after every five (5) years.
  - d) The Ministry, through NEMA had put in place strong monitoring systems of all major wetlands in Kenya and Ramsar sites in particular. Kenya has six (6) Ramsar sites. Five (5) of them are in the Rift Valley namely; Lake Baringo, Lake Bogoria, Lake Nakuru, Lake Naivasha and Lake Elementaita. The sixth one is the giant Tana Delta in Tana River.
  - e) The Ministry had identified other major wetlands in the Country and was in the process of gazettelement for their protection for the preparation of management plans. These include: Kibirong, Kingwal, Sio-Siteko, Lake Kanyaboli, Ol bolosat and Ewaso-Narok. By way of public participation in line with Article 10 as read with article 232 of the Constitution of

Kenya 2010, the process of revitalizing Lake Kamnarok and resuscitation of Lake Turkana, Lake Jipe, Lake Chala and Kenyatta are on schedule.

- f) The Ministry had formulated an Integrated Coastal Zone Management Policy (ICZM Policy), ICZM Action Plan and ICZM Implementation Strategies. It had also generated State of the Coast Report Second Edition in 2017, Awareness and Behavioural Change Communication Strategy 2016-2021 towards integrated Management of Kenya's Coastal and Marine Resources for the Country, highlighting changes in trends and conservation interventions of the Kenyan Coast.

2. On why NEMA continued to allow the intrusion and destruction of wetlands in the Country through indiscriminate infills, construction and establishments of structures on water springs and riparian lands, such as land between Kanyagia and Kiambu Roads, land in Embulbul-Ngong Township area, Kigwa springs, land near the Northern bypass flyover, as well as the wetlands at Mjini Stream that runs parallel to Murang'a Road in Murang'a Town he stated that:

- a) The Ministry through NEMA had formulated and gazetted Environmental and Social Impact Assessment Regulations 2003. These regulations operationalize Section 58 and 67 of EMCA 1999, which compels all project proponents (Individuals, Private Entities, MDAs and County Governments) to undertake mandatory ESIA and submit to NEMA for approval or rejection before proponent commences construction and development of the site.
- b) NEMA had never sanctioned and or allowed intrusion and destruction of wetlands in the Country through indiscriminate infill, construction and establishment of structures on water springs and riparian lands as alleged by the member for Kangema Constituency. This happened only as a result of systematic failure of MDAs and County Governments who approve such establishments without any reference to NEMA.
- c) Environmental protection was a responsibility for all living in Kenya, by cooperating with NEMA, being patriotic, law abiding citizens and willingly protecting wetlands. Above all, all Government Ministries, Departments, Agencies and County Governments must take their mandate seriously and implement the policies, the regulations and the Environmental laws in the country to file Environmental Audit Report annually in line with Section 67 of EMCA 1999.

3. On what action was the Ministry taking to reclaim wet and riparian lands and protect them from further encroachments he stated that:

- a) The Ministry with enhanced capacity to NEMA in terms of manpower, machinery, material and financial resources, will ensure it up scales inspection and monitoring all wetlands in the County, update the wetland inventory after every two years, gazette significant wetlands, prepare management plans for wetlands, remove



illegal structures on wetland riparian, protect all springs countrywide and ensure safe water quality flow into our lakes, rivers, marshes, springs.

- b) Further the Ministry would like to request Parliament to harmonize existing conflicts of laws as regards to riparian zones in EMCA 1999, Water Act 2012 and Agriculture Act, which undermine effective compliance and enforcement process as regards to wetlands and riparian zones.
- c) Further, the entire Nairobi and Central Kenya are wetlands and more so catchment areas for Athi and Tana Rivers. Most of the Estates are not connected to sewer lines. This situation will make the rivers and lakes dirty and highly polluted. The entire Rivers in Nairobi, Athi in Machakos and Sosian in Eldoret are polluted. The Ministry can only urge the entities concerned to construct adequate sewer lines and compel home owners to connect to the sewer lines as it has always been doing.

- **OBSERVATIONS**

Members observed that:

1. The Ministry and NEMA ought to be proactive since most of the reported degradation of wetlands was happening in the open, along highways hence would not escape their view.
2. The degradation of wetlands had huge implications on impacts of climate change and food security concerns.
3. There were challenges of overlapping laws with respect to wetland definition and therefore conservation. This needed harmonization.
4. Wetlands were threatened across the country and NEMA seemed overwhelmed in execution of its mandate in terms of inadequate staff and budgetary allocations.
5. There was need to sensitize members of the public on the importance of wetland conservation in order to ensure sustainable wetland conservation based on community participation.
6. There was need for action form NEMA and the Ministry to conserve wetlands instead of relying on paper reports that had no bearing on actual conservation efforts.
7. There was need to reform NEMA which was allegedly steeped in corrupt dealings in order to protect those degrading wetlands, among other areas.
8. There was need to develop an institutional framework for wetland conservation.
9. There was need for the Ministry and NEMA to take decisive action on the causes of damage to the wetlands failure to which its effect on climate change will intense.

## **CONFLICT IN KIBWEZI EAST CONSTITUENCY.**

The Hon. Jessicah Mbalu, CBS, MP appeared before the Committee and briefed it that:

1. The fourth schedule of the constitution assigns the national government the responsibility of protection of the environment and natural resources.
2. In the recent past, residents of Masongaleni, Thange, Mtito Andei and Ivingoni-Nzambani wards in Kibwezi East Constituency had experienced increasing attacks by elephants resulting in loss of lives and livestock and destruction of crops and property.
3. Numerous cases of HWC had been reported to authorities and claims for compensation lodged in vain.
4. Most parts of the constituency, including schools, bordering National Parks remain unfenced making it easy for animals to stray out.
5. Learning in most schools bordering the National Parks had been paralyzed at times for several weeks due to attacks by especially elephants.
6. The KWS wardens were clearly overwhelmed resulting in delay in responding to distress calls from residents.
7. Efforts of the residents to resolve the matter through demonstrations against the inaction by the KWS had borne no results.

She then stated that her prayers were that the National Assembly through the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources:

1. Intervenes to ensure the KWS expeditiously compensates victims and affected families for loss of lives and destruction of property.
2. Recommends that KWS erects an electric fence at all areas with schools in Masongaleni, Thange, Mtito Andei and Ivingoni-Nzambani wards bordering Tsavo East and West National Parks and Kyulu Hills National Park to mitigate conflicts.
3. Intervenes through the relevant ministry to facilitate the KWS to increase the number of posts or camps in the area for effective surveillance and quick response to distress calls whenever elephants stray to human settlements.

- a) The Hon. Shakeel Shabbir, MP reported that there was still dumping at a dumpsite in Kisumu which Ministry of Environment officials had indicated was not to be used anymore for dumping. He also pointed out that Kibos River was still being polluted by industrial discharge. There was need for decisive action from the ministry of environment and forestry.

**Resolution**

It was resolved that the Chief Administrative Secretary, Ministry of Environment and Forestry who was visiting Kisumu shall revisit the place, witness the on goings and chart the way forward.
