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EXPLANATORY NOTE

The form of the expenditure estimates for 1962-63 differs from that of previous years. The 20 Votes are each divided into three parts—

- Part I contains the gross amount of expenditure estimated to be required for the Vote and the ambit of the Vote.
- Part II sets out the subheads of the Vote (by Divisions where appropriate) by which the Organization will account for the expenditure to the Assembly,
- Part III contains the details of the Part II subheads of the Vote by which warrant holders will account for their expenditure to the Treasury of the Organization.

Parts I and II of each Vote, together with a memorandum on the Vote, are on pages 2 to 52. The Part III details of each Vote are found on pages 53 to 113.

Part II of each Vote, in addition to indicating the subheads making up the gross amount of the estimate, contains a subhead Z to indicate the amount of revenues or "appropriations-in-aid" which are receivable into the General Fund specifically for the purpose of the Vote, such as reimbursements from other Votes, contributions and grants from Governments and other administrations and institutions, and miscellaneous revenues. The amount of subhead Z deducted from the gross expenditure of the Vote indicates the cost of the Vote to the general revenues of the Organization derived from its share of the Distributable Pool Fund and other balances in the General Fund. Details of subhead Z are shown in Part III of each Vote.

Where an expenditure estimate contains a revote, i.e. provision usually for a special expenditure project which was begun in a previous year and is expected to be continued or completed in the year to which the estimate relates, the share of the revoted expenditure which is attributable to the general revenues of the Organization is included in the "net total" expenditure shown in the part II of the Estimate.

VOTE 1—COURT OF APPEAL FOR EASTERN AFRICA

Provision for the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa has been made in previous years in the estimates of the Government of Kenya. Administration of the Court was transferred to the East African Common Services Organization, on its coming into being, under Article 45 of the Constitution. In Part II of the estimate for the Court the provision for 1961–62 and the previous financial year relates to provision made in the estimates of the Government of Kenya.

VOTE 2-THE CENTRAL LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

The provision estimated is £95 more than for the current year; it takes account of the Assembly's enlarged membership of forty-one Members and the replacement of salaries for Members by increased attendance allowances. The provision for travelling expenses allows only for the holding of meetings of the Assembly at Nairobi.

VOTE 2—THE CENTRAL LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

I—ESTIMATE of the gross amount required in the year ending June 30th, 1963, for the salaries and expenses of the Central Legislative Assembly and for the expenses of the office of the Clerk of the Assembly.

VOTE 3—PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

The estimate includes provision for the Public Service Commission, already partly expanded in the current financial year, for the non-self-contained services of the East African Common Services Organization and includes the full costs of the posts of Chairman and Deputy Chairman which are shared with the Public Service Commissions of each self-contained service. Contributions will be received from the self-contained services in respect of the costs of these posts.

The establishment of the new Commission is increased by a Deputy Chairman and executive and clerical staff to take account of its wider functions. There are also four Members of the Commission for whom provision for Attendance Allowance is made.

The increase on other subheads is consequential on the increased establishment, and the provision for travel is to cover the expenses of interviewing candidates, hitherto borne on departmental votes, and of holding meetings of the Commission from time to time in the territories.

VOTE 4—OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL

The provision for Division A reflects the establishment considered necessary to meet the requirements of the Secretary General's Office resulting from the recent reorganization. The comparative establishment for the year 1961–62 includes certain posts which are for 1962–63 shown under the vote for the Secretariat to the Ministerial Committees for Communications and for Social and Research Services. In addition to the two substantive posts of Assistant Secretary included for 1962–63, there are two supernumerary posts of Assistant Secretary provided under the Localization and Training Vote. The provision for travelling expenses is increased to provide centrally for the expenses of Ministerial Committee meetings and allied committees, with consequential reductions on the provision in other votes. The provision for office expenses is increased on account of higher expected use of postal and telegraphic services and for stationery.

The provision for Division B represents the recurrent expenditure required for maintaining owned and rented property and special expenditure of some £145, 000 for a number of capital works including £80,000 to commence an office building in Dar es Salaam, £54,000 for housing for Customs Preventive staff in Mombasa and £6,750 for the completion of extensions to the Headquarters building in Nairobi where more office accommodation is required.

The provision in Division C is that estimated to be required under the C.D. & W. Scheme administered by the Organization for providing an Adviser for East African students in the United States.

VOTE 5—OFFICE OF THE LEGAL SECRETARY

The establishment provides for the replacement of one post of Senior Assistant Legal Secretary by two posts of Assistant Legal Secretary, the latter to be filled by local officers. Because it is unlikely that full use can be made of the incumbents of the two new posts for Court work until they have acquired experience, provision has been increased by £1,000 for putting out work to local counsel, expenditure which it is hoped to reduce in future years. Full provision has been included for the post of Secretary/Stenographer, for which token provision only was made in the current financial year, as the volume of work has indicated need for the post to be filled. Provision has hitherto been made for temporary clerical assistance and has been deleted for 1962–63. The Personal Emoluments subhead shows a net reduction compared with the current year owing to reduced pension contributions as a result of certain officers being re-engaged on contract terms of service

Provision for travelling has hitherto been inadequate and has been increased by £160 and additional housing expenditure is necessary as fewer officers will be on vacation leave in the year. Special expenditure is included for office furniture and equipment for the new posts.

VOTE 7-ROYAL EAST AFRICAN NAVY

The estimate represents the provision for that part of the staff which is required for periods up to September 30th, 1962 for winding up the Royal East African Navy. Terminal benefits including leave pay and gratuities are also provided for the officers, ratings and administrative staff. Retirement passages and rates on buildings are the major items of Other Charges.

VOTE 8-TREASURY

The vote for the Treasury replaces the current year's vote for the Office of the Administrator (Finance, Statistics, Economic Co-ordination and Accounts). The Treasury is also responsible under the Financial Secretary for providing the secretariats to the Ministerial Committees for Finance and for Commercial and Industrial Co-ordination.

The overall establishment reflects a net increase of three new posts of clerks for the Statistics Division after taking account of reduction of one post of clerk in the Finance Division which has proved possible by pooling stenographic and clerical staff with the Accounts Division. Two supernumerary Assistant Secretaries, provided under the Localization and Training vote, are expected to be in post during the year in the Finance and Economic Co-ordination Divisions. The establishment also reflects the following upgradings made as a result of a review of responsibilities and reorganization of work schedules—two posts of Assistant Secretary, A, in place of Organization and Methods Officer B1 and Economic Officer B3–1, one Accountant B4–2 to Senior Accountant, and one Accounts Officer C4 in place of one Accounting Assistant C6–5. One Personal Secretary Grade II has been downgraded to Secretary/Stenographer.

The provision for housing shows an increase because the incidence of vacation leave is expected to be lower in the year.

VOTE 8—TREASURY

I—ESTIMATE of the gross amount required in the year ending June 30th, 1963, for the salaries and expenses of the Treasury, including the Office of the Financial Secretary, the Finance, Accounts, Statistical, Economic and Industrial Co-ordination, Trade and Marketing Divisions, and for the East African Hides and Leather Bureau.

VOTE 9-MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES

The estimate reflects the increased provision required in the year for compensation for Designated Officers under the Overseas Service Aid Scheme and for increased pensions, including commuted pensions.

Provision is included under subhead 1 for the payment to East African Governments of interest on their balances held in the General Fund.

VOTE 9—MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES

I—ESTIMATE of the gross amount required in the year ending June 30th, 1963, for Interest Charges, Sinking Funds and Loan Repayments, for payments in respect of Audit Services, for the payment of certain emoluments, educational allowances, gratuities, passage costs and compensation in respect of Designated Officers under the Overseas Service Aid Scheme Agreement with Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, for the payment of pensions, including commuted pensions, and for certain miscellaneous charges.

VOTE 10—EAST AFRICAN CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT

The subhead for Personal Emoluments represents an increase of some £40,000 and there is an overall increase of four posts. In the current financial year the regrading and reclassification of certain posts was made to provide—

- (a) a new post of Assistant Deputy Commissioner in place of one post of Regional Commissioner;
- (b) a reclassification of 28 Principal, Senior and Collector posts into nine posts of Principal Collectors and 19 posts of Collectors, the net effect of which is an upgrading of four posts to Principal Collectors and an upgrading of 17 Collector posts B4-2 to B3-1;
- (c) a reclassification and regrading of Customs Officers (C4-3, C4 and E4-C5) and Examining Officers (C3-2 and C6-4) to Examining Officers C3-2, C6-4 and Customs Officers E4-C5.

Of the combined establishment for Examining Officers and Customs Officers there is a proposed increase of 14 posts; two of these are in respect of Examining Officer posts which were approved for anti-smuggling measures at the 47th Meeting of S.C.F., three for upgradings of clerical officers to Customs Officers for the Dar es Salaam Long Room, four Examining Officer posts for Mombasa Outdoor Collection and Collection at Kilindini and for training for the Mombasa Oil Refinery, and five Customs Officer posts for Kilindini, Mombasa and Kampala. There is a reduction of 36 Preventive Staff and an increase of 26 Preventive Officers. The increase in the latter is due to eight posts approved for anti-smuggling measures at the 47th Meeting of S.C.F. in August, 1961, and to further development in reorganizing the Preventive Service to replace illiterate staff by a smaller force of literate staff. The combined establishment of 45 for Accounts Staff and Executive Staff compared with 1961–62 establishment reflects more accurately the duties of the staff and an overall increase of six posts; of these five are on account of upgradings from clerical posts and one is a new post of Accounts Officer Grade II for Uganda. The establishment of clerks is reduced by eight (net) on account of regradings; one post has been regraded to Telephonist E4–1 and one new clerical post is included for Mombasa.

The estimate for other subheads represents an increase of approximately £29,000 over the provision originally approved for the current financial year, of which some £16,000 is on account of accounting and audit costs under the Miscellaneous Other Charges subhead for which provision was not included in the original 1961–62 estimate. The provision for housing in the current year was reduced, administratively, in the estimate too severely and allowance has been made for housing for 1962–63 to cover requirements more realistically. There is an increase provided under Travelling Expenses and Maintenance and Running Expenses for which the approved level for the current year is proving inadequate. The provision originally approved for 1961–62 did not take account of expenditure on anti-smuggling measures.

VOTE 11—EAST AFRICAN INCOME TAX DEPARTMENT

The estimate reflects an increase in the gross expenditure of £13,183 compared with the current year's estimate. The overall establishment remains unchanged at 553 posts but there is an increase of one post of Regional Commissioner with a corresponding reduction of one post of Assistant Commissioner to take charge of training. The increase in Personal Emoluments is due to providing fully for the nine posts of Assessors held in abeyance in 1961–62 by the eventual promotion of Tax Officers being trained for Assessors' duties.

An increase of £16,500 is due to a charge for Audit and Accounting Services which was not included in the approved estimate for 1961–62 but for which an equivalent amount has since been authorised in the current financial year; and there are small increases for rent and maintenance which are offset by reductions in other subheads.

VOTE 13-INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH

A-RESEARCH ORGANIZATION (C.D. & W. SCHEME R.1200)

The overall increase of provision of £1,299 under Personal Emoluments is due mainly to gratuities, the rate for which in respect of contract officers has been increased from 13½ per cent to 25 per cent, to provision for all Laboratory Technicians for a full twelve months and to normal increments. There is no change in establishment except the redesignation of one clerical post as Telephone Operator. The provision for other subheads shows an increase of £312 mainly on account of mileage allowance for the Ceramic Consultant and higher provision for maintenance of buildings which have now been occupied for five years. Owing to reallocation of subheads there is an increase in provision for Replacements and a decrease for Special Expenditure, the latter subhead no longer including replacement items.

B-EXPENSES OF CHEMICAL ENGINEER (C.D. & W. SCHEME R.1199)

Provision is made for the continuation of this scheme for the provision of a Chemical Engineer to assist in the Organization's work. It is financed wholly by a grant from Her Majesty's Government.

VOTE 15-AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH

A—OVERALL RESEARCH SCHEME (C.D. & W. SCHEME R.1176)

The estimate reflects the expenditure required for the continuation of existing research organizations and research programmes with the exception of the E.A. Marine Fisheries Research Organization which, as recently announced, is now being disbanded. An amount of £6,950 is included for leave salary allowances and passages of staff of the Marine Fisheries Organization.

The establishment of the other research organizations remains unchanged except for 23 new graded posts in the E scale and Subordinate Service arising out of promotions from staff on daily rates of pay.

B-OTHER RESEARCH AND MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES

Provision is made for the continuation of existing supplementary research programmes financed mainly by grants from external Foundations and Organizations, and for a new programme of Tilapia Research financed by the Nuffield Foundation, to be carried out at Jinja.

The subhead special expenditure includes provision of £450 for the fire-proofing of the East African Herbarium, Nairobi, as a precaution against the loss of many valuable and irreplaceable specimens; grants totalling £9,470 by the Rockefeller Foundation for the provision of equipment for animal physiology research; and a grant of £1,785 from the World Health Organization for experimental studies in Bilharziasis at the E.A. Veterinary Research Organization.

VOTE 16-MEDICAL RESEARCH

GENERAL

The gross estimate for the Vote is £15,053 more than in the current financial year and provides for the continuation of existing research at approximately the present level, subject to the changes referred to under specific heads below.

OVERALL MEDICAL RESEARCH SCHEME

The total provision of £141,721 includes special expenditure revotes of £6,400 and represents a slight increase on the provision for the current financial year. In the E.A. Institute of Malaria and Vector-borne Diseases provision is reduced by transferring to the Localization and Training Vote the vacant post of Assistant Scientific Officer and the employment of a Field Officer in the Training Grade in the Pare-Taveta Vital Statistics Survey. In the E.A. Institute for Medical Research establishment remains the same but there is a substantial reduction because no gratuities will be payable in the year and because less provision will be required for maintenance due to an extensive programme of urgent repairs being carried out this year by reallocation of expenditure. The establishment of the E.A. Virus Research Institute remains unchanged although token provision only is included for one Research Officer vacancy. There is however a substantial increase for the Medical Research Secretary for whom a gratuity is due for payment in the course of the year.

EAST AFRICAN LEPROSY RESEARCH CENTRE

There is a £2,225 reduction due to no need for leave passages or special expenditure in the year.

OTHER MEDICAL RESEARCH

The C.D. & W. Scheme for Schistosomiasis Research lapses in the current financial year.

Increased provision is made for the Medical Research Fund to the extent of the expected balance of the 100 per cent grant at June 30th, 1962. The current C.D. & W. Scheme is operative until June, 1963. Additional provision of £13,350 is made for the Tuberculosis Investigation. The amount of £20,350 represents the expected balance in the 50 per cent C.D. & W. Scheme at June 30th, 1962 together with £10,000 from an expected supplementary grant under an extended scheme for the period ending June 30th, 1964. The provision for the Pare–Taveta Vital Statistics Survey is reduced as the capital part of the current year's provision will be spent this year except for a small revote included in the estimate for 1962–63. An increase is included for the expenses of the Nutritional Ophthalmology Research programme financed by the U.S. Public Health Service.

It is anticipated that the World Health Organization will make a further continuation grant for the Supplementary Virus Research Programme and provision has been made in the amount of the grants for the two previous years.

VOTE 16-MEDICAL RESEARCH

VOTE 17-DESERT LOCUST SURVEY

The estimate for the Desert Locust Survey represents the amount required in 1962–63 on the assumption that the Survey will remain as a department of East African Common Services Organization. In the event of the Convention establishing the proposed Desert Locust Control Organization for Eastern Africa being ratified the expenditure that would be required on East African Common Services Organization votes is expected to be confined to an amount of some £30,000 to provide for a small East African Unit and £24,337 for terminal payment.

The total provision now estimated for the Vote shows a reduction of £160,000 compared with the current year after taking account of provision of £24,337 required for terminal payments to staff leaving upon reorganization. The reduction is due to a reorganization of the Survey based on a substantially reduced vehicle strength, a smaller headquarters organization, and a discontinuation of provision both for financial and material support to the Ethiopian and Somali Governments and the £10,500 contribution to the F.A.O. Eastern African Regional Fund. The estimate nevertheless represents provision for effective anti-locust measures with a greater emphasis on the use of aircraft for both reconnaissance and control and includes provision for the purchase of a new reconnaissance aircraft and an enlarged research division.

VOTE 18—EAST AFRICAN LITERATURE BUREAU

A—EAST AFRICAN LITERATURE BUREAU (C.D. & W. SCHEME D.4043)

Of the increase in provision of £3,436, £1,323 is on account of Personal Emoluments. Although no change in establishment is proposed other than a regrading of Production Officers from C5-3 to B5-2, the increase in Personal Emoluments is due to an increase of £695 for clerks arising from a general reconstitution of the "E" scale to permit accelerated promotion based on proficiency and length of service and to normal salary increments. The increase of £2,113 under other subheads is due to expected claims for housing allowances in accordance with Regulations from junior staff not at present drawing house allowance, to higher passage incidence in the year, to the purchase of a replacement vehicle for the Kenya area, to minor increases in office expenses and to provision for maintenance of department buildings, the provision for which has proved inadequate in the current year for essential repairs.

B—ARABIC BOOK PRODUCTION UNIT (C.D. & W. SCHEME D.4706)

The estimate provides for the continuation of work on the production of school books in Arabic and teaching material. The expenses are financed wholly by a grant from Her Majesty's Government.

C-LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT IN TANGANYIKA

Provision is made for the expenditure of funds made available by the Government of Tanganyika specifically for the development of a Libraries Service under the direction of the East African Literature Bureau pending the establishment of a Libraries Service by the Tanganyika Government. Provision for this purpose has been authorized for the current year but no expenditure has yet been incurred pending the appointment of a Director for the proposed service.

VOTE 18—EAST AFRICAN LITERATURE BUREAU

VOTE 19—EAST AFRICAN DIRECTORATE OF CIVIL AVIATION

A-DIRECTORATE

The establishment reflects an overall reduction of sixteen posts, but since 22 posts of Technical staff operating meteorological telecommunications have been transferred to the vote of the Meteorological Department for 1962–63, and the post of Aviation Administrative Officer has been transferred to the Directorate Vote, there is an effective increase of five posts. For Headquarters and the Regions a post in the basic salary grade of £2,175 is included for new responsibilities in the Directorate for licensing matters and the head of the secretariat to the Civil Aviation Board; an additional Senior Aviation Officer post is included to provide for the Kenya Region services which are at present performed by staff of Headquarters and which the present Headquarters staff cannot continue to provide due to the increased duties of the Directorate under the new Air Navigation Order and Air Service Licensing regulations; and provision is included for the cost of a third post of Air Registration Board Surveyor whose services are essential in view of the increased numbers and size of aircraft registered in East Africa.

In the Air Traffic Control (Operations) section four new posts of Air Traffic Control Officer B4-2 are required for increased watch keeping hours at Dar es Salaam and Mombasa for F.27 aircraft night services and for a necessary increase for the leave relief pool. Provision is made for two of the posts for six months only. There has been a regrading of Air Traffic Control staff in the current year to the B scale, with 10 posts at B1 and 39 posts at B4-2. In the Telecommunications and Engineering section there has been a regrading and reclassification of posts in the current financial year and an overall reduction of seven posts is proposed for 1962-63 in the Telecommunications section. The establishment of Senior Technical Assistants is increased by 16 posts. The duties of seven of these posts will cover work previously done by expatriate officers and nine posts are to provide an avenue of promotion for E scale staff who have shown themselves to be of above average ability. The decrease of 35 in the establishment of Technical Assistants includes the transfer of 22 officers on telecommunications duties to the Meteorological Department. Provision is included for 15 technical staff engaged on contract from International Aeradio Limited for the period ending December, 1962. The provision for travelling expenses is increased to permit more extensive travelling on aerodrome inspections and maintenance of telecommunications equipment. Maintenance expenses are expected to be lower chiefly because the Heron aircraft will not require so extensive an overhaul as during the current year. Housing expenses were underestimated for the current financial year and the provision takes account of a higher proportion of senior staff being in post throughout the year. The increase for Replacements is primarily for a Technical servicing vehicle and test gear and tools. Medical Capitation Fees have increased and are responsible for the increased estimate for Miscellaneous Other Charges.

The Special Expenditure subhead includes provision of £27,700 for new works and equipment as well as a total of £49,780 for works and equipment authorized in previous years.

B-TRAINING SCHOOL

This division incorporates for 1962–63 provision for the Telecommunications training programme hitherto shown as part of the Directorate and for an additional 20 Trainees for the third intake into the Air Traffic Control Assistants Training School. As the Telecommunications School and the additional training posts are not included in the existing C.D. & W. Scheme they have been shown under separate subheads in the estimate for accounting purposes.

Provision is included for flying tuition for the first intake of trainees. Special Expenditure includes the balance of the approved C.D. & W. Scheme provision estimated to be required for the Air Traffic Control Training School in 1962–63.

VOTE 20—EAST AFRICAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT

A-GENERAL

The increase of £17,209 for Personal Emoluments is due to the transfer from the Directorate of Civil Aviation of 22 Technical Assistants and for 13 new Technical Assistants posts for the operation of the new meteorological telecommunications service transferred from Nairobi Airport to Headquarters at Dagoretti Corner, to normal salary increments and to three new posts of Senior Technical Assistants. The three posts were reduced in the current year's estimates on creation of three posts of Inspecting Officers. The reduction has left available only four Senior Technical Assistants for forecasting duties at Nairobi Airport and restoration of the three posts is considered the minimum necessary for these duties. The proposed increase in establishment together with an expected higher number of officers in post in the year brings a consequential need for an increase in Housing Expenses and Travel Expenses. The provision for Travel Expenses includes £2,140 for attendance at the 4th Congress of the World Meteorological Organization in Geneva, the Conference of Commonwealth Meteorologists in London and the Commission for Agricultural Meteorology at Toronto.

Provision for maintenance has been increased to take account of more extensive maintenance of the Headquarters Building considered necessary next year and for more adequate maintenance of plant and equipment.

Provision for replacements is increased on account of a rise in costs of many technical stores, and for materials for the new Facsimile Equipment.

Provision for Special Expenditure has been reduced; it includes purchase of Facsimile Equipment and basic spares (financed by a 100 per cent C.D. & W. Scheme), technical equipment for improving the standard of stations in Tanganyika and Uganda, replacement of the storm detection radar at Nairobi Airport which, purchased in 1954, has been unserviceable for some months owing to difficulty in obtaining replacement parts, and a hydrogen generating plant designed to reduce recurrent expenditure.

B—RESEARCH SECTION

The total provision shows an increase compared with the current year mainly on account of revotes of provision for equipment for cloud seeding experiments deferred on account of unsuitable weather.

C-TRAINING SCHOOL

Owing to a revision of plans for the Training School no expenditure has been incurred in 1961–62 on the Entebbe buildings provided for in the current year's estimates. In the light of indications that funds may be available from the World Meteorological Organization for a school building if training facilities can be offered, on a full cost reimbursement basis, to staff outside the East African Region, it is proposed to site the school at Headquarters, Dagoretti. Provision has therefore been included for a revote of the current year's capital expenditure provision and an additional £20,000 for a school building to be financed from external sources. Provision for recurrent expenditure has been included for one month of the year only.
