STATEMENT ON PAYMENT OF LIVESTOCK TRADERS AND FIRST COMMUNITY BANK BY KENYA MEAT COMMISSION AS REQUESTED BY HON. ABBAS SHEIKH MOHAMMED, MP WAJIR EAST CONSTITUENCY

1.0. BACKGROUND

The MP for Wajir East Constituency, Hon. Abbas Sheikh Mohammed has requested a Statement from the Chairman of the Standing Committee on Agriculture, Livestock and Cooperatives regarding the deteriorating financial status of the Kenya Meat Commission (KMC).

In the statement the Chairman of the Committee is expected to enquire into and report on:

- a) *The capacity of the Commission is offsetting the monies owed to farmers as soon as possible given that most of these farmers also took loans from banks and are now having their properties auctioned:*
- b) *Whether the Government is able and ready to bail out the Commission as it has done with others like Agricultural Finance Corporation (AFC) and Agriculture Development Corporation (ADC);*
- c) *Plans the Government has to establish financial schemes which are accessible to farmers or livestock groups to enable them to trade in livestock business, like relocating money from open arms like AFC so that livestock farmers are paid; and*
- d) *The status of the **Kshs. 100million** allocated to AFC during the last recorded drought to bail out livestock farmers, particularly pastoralists.*

2.0 RESPONSE

2.1 Introduction

It is true that the Kenya Meat Commission owes livestock producers and traders a total sum of **Kshs. 270, 981,396.05** being made up of the following:

- Payments due to the First Community Bank **Kshs. 119,217,625.00**. The amount owed to the First Community Bank covers the period February 2012 to August 2012. This amount is inclusive of interest out of the original **Kshs. 114, 790,706** as at August 2012.
- Payments owed to livestock traders amount to **Kshs. 151,763,771.05**. These amounts cover the period August 2012 to March 2014.

(The details are attached in **Annexes 1 and 2** respectively)

The contract signed by the Commission and traders states that 40% of the payment due is payable within 14 days. The balance is paid between 30 to 45 days based on mutual agreement between the supplier and the Commission. Due to the financial challenges the Commission is currently facing, these contracts are not fully honored. Between **August 2012** and **March 2014** livestock valued at **Kshs. 238,719,930** has been supplied to the Commission. A sum of **Kshs. 86,956,159** has been paid to various suppliers over the same period. The amount outstanding is **Kshs. 151,763,771** (see annex 1). These amounts exclude the sums owed to the First Community Bank of **Kshs. 119,217,625** as at 23rd March 2014.

2.2 Capacity of the Commission to offset debts

The Commission is saddled with a debt burden of **Kshs. 397 million** due to both livestock suppliers and general creditors. This debt is a major challenge to the Commission's operations and has contributed to the delay in settling payments due to livestock suppliers and eroded their confidence in the commission. This lack of confidence has affected slaughter levels at the Commission resulting in the current poor performance of the Commission.

The Kenya Meat Commission was allocated a total of **Kshs. 50 Million** in the FY 2013/14. This allocation was however insufficient to cater for their financial obligations and operational costs for the whole financial year given that several pending bills had accrued from the previous financial year. Therefore, the available funds were prioritised to cater for salary arrears and pending bills.

In view of the above, the Ministry through the State Department of Livestock submitted a proposal to the National Treasury amounting to **Kshs. 71, 856,760** for reallocation to KMC as capital grant.

The request was not factored in the first supplementary budget estimates because by the time the proposals were sent to the National treasury the preparation of the revised budget had been finalised way back in December 2013. The National Treasury has responded to our letter requesting for reallocation of funds to KMC but unfortunately it has **declined** to allow for re-allocation of **Kshs.31, 856,760** (copy of the letter attached). However, the State Department is still waiting for a response on the reallocation request for the remaining **Kshs. 40 million**

2.3 Bailout of the Commission

There is already a Turnaround Business Plan of **Kshs. 1Billion** which has been prepared by KMC management and approved by the Board. This amount of **Kshs. 1Billion** is not captured in the revised budget which has already been passed. However, the amount required to carry out the plan has been **factored in 2014/2015 budget proposal**

The Turnaround Business Plan is meant to upgrade and modernize the Commission. Through the upgrading and modernisation program, the following will be pursued

- i. Improvement of the existing factory facilities and infrastructure to improve production efficiency;
- ii. A staff rationalisation programme to improve productivity will be undertaken;
- iii. KMC's market share will be increased through a wider product range and through penetration of new markets locally and internationally;
- iv. The Commission will establish a buffer stock of livestock at the **10,000 acre** East African Portland Cement Factory Ranch Ranch, Athi river and the **11,000 acre** Mackinnon Ranch in Kwale County to stabilise KMC business.
- v. The existing legal and corporate governance framework will be reviewed to enable KMC become commercially effective.

Through this initiative, the key deliverables will be the following:

a) Factory upgrading and modernisation

In the short-term, **Kshs. 580 million** will be used to upgrade the factory machinery, facilities and infrastructure at Athi River, Landhies

Road and Kibarani. The upgrading will increase operational efficiency, lower factory maintenance costs and enable KMC to meet the required international standards for an export abattoir. KMC will also automate its processes to enhance its internal controls through acquisition of an enterprise resource plan (ERP).

b) Human resource restructuring

KMC currently has a staff establishment of 478 at an annual cost of **Kshs. 260 million**.

In light of the need to improve the productivity of KMC staff and as part of the financial turnaround strategy of the Commission, a staff rationalisation programme will be carried out. This is meant to align the existing human resource capital in terms of numbers, competence and productivity to the business objectives. The rationalisation programme will be undertaken at a projected cost of **Kshs. 154 million** which will result in a saving of **Kshs. 62 million** annually from the salaries and wages, gratuity/ pension and medical benefits.

c) Marketing Strategy

KMC intends to increase its domestic share of market as well as increase export to its traditional and new markets. In order to increase the market share to a profitable level, KMC shall increase and sustain higher sales volumes by mounting aggressive marketing campaigns, re-engineering distribution channels, targeting non traditional emerging markets and product diversification. The Commission will invest **Kshs. 46 million** of the **Kshs. 580 million** capital expenditure for distribution and marketing vehicles and display chillers for enhanced cold chain in the distribution channels.

Through these initiatives projected revenues will grow from the current projection of **Kshs. 537 million** to **Kshs. 1.5 billion** in the first year and to **Kshs. 3 billion** by the end of the third year.

2.3 Financial Schemes to Facilitate Trade by Farmers and Livestock Groups

In an effort to stimulate economic activity in the ASAL areas of the country, the Government established the Livestock Enterprise Fund through Legal Notice No 58 of May 2012.

The objectives and purpose of the fund are as follows:

- i. Provide grants to livestock producers for emergency interventions
- ii. Provide loans to livestock producers and pastoralists for restocking after losses occasioned by calamities
- iii. Provide loans to medium and small enterprises dealing in livestock and livestock products
- iv. Provide Credit facilities for livestock related micro enterprises and pastoral and agro-pastoral enterprises

A sum of **Kshs. 500 million** was allocated to the fund in the FY 2012/2013. The fund will become operational as soon as the Board is gazetted by the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries.

2.4 Status of the Kshs. 100 million allocated to the Agricultural Finance Corporation

The Agricultural finance Corporation was issued with a sum of **Kshs. 100 million** during the year 2006 to implement an Emergency Livestock Offtake Programme. A further sum of **Kshs. 200 million** was issued in 2009 and a third sum of **Kshs. 427 million** was issued in March 2011. In total **Kshs. 727 million** has been issued to AFC to date for this programme.

Since inception the Corporation has processed and disbursed loans to over **857 ranchers** and livestock traders to purchase livestock from drought stricken areas. The Corporation disbursed a total of **Kshs. 735.6 million** to purchase an estimated **73,562 head of cattle by July 2012**. The balance of **Kshs. 145.6 million** was used to finance the purchase of feeds, veterinary drugs and procure transport for animals.

The loan collection performance has been impressive with a loan repayment rate of **86%**. This is better than any other program being implemented by AFC currently. As a result of this, the Corporation has established a revolving fund of over **Kshs. 700 million** and the programme has since been converted into a continuous off take arrangement where funds collected from the loan beneficiaries are revolved into new loans.

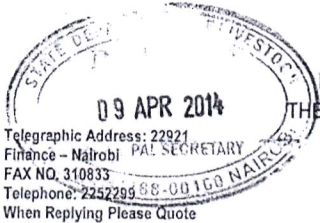

Your letter Ref. no. MLD/KMC/2 TY (25) dated 21st January, 2014 on the above subject refers.

After a careful review of your request, we have noted that the funds earmarked for reallocation were meant for on-going construction of various slaughterhouses across the country. The proposed reallocation in our view may result to non-payment of certificates issued against certified works on these projects hence giving rise to pending bills. In addition, the proposed reallocation is not in line with the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 Section 43, which guides on powers to reallocate appropriated funds.

In the light of the foregoing, the National Treasury has not considered the request to reallocate funds.
