EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH (DECLARATION OF FORMIDABLE EPIDEMIC DISEASE) ORDER, 2020

A. The Purpose of the Rules

The general purpose of the *Public Health (Declaration of Formidable Epidemic Disease) Order*, 2020 is to notify the country of COVID-19 as a formidable disease. The specific objectives of the Order is to declare COVID-19 as a formidable disease in order to alert the public of the eminent threat posed by COVID-19.

1. The Legislative Context

Section 35 of the of the Public Health Act, Chapter 242 of the Laws of Kenya gives the Minister (Cabinet Secretary) responsible for Health (hereinafter, the Cabinet Secretary) the power to declare, by order, a disease a formidable epidemic disease. By Legal Notice No. 37 dated 27th March 2020, the Cabinet Secretary declared COVID-19 a formidable epidemic disease. The present Order therefore has been made in this context.

2. Policy Background

The World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a public health emergency on 30th January 2020. Since then, the disease continues to spread rapidly, across boundaries. The disease spreads mainly through close contact with infected persons. On 13th March 2020, Kenya confirmed

its first case of COVID-19. As at 15th April, 2020, there were a total of two hundred and twenty five (225) confirmed case of COVID-19 in Kenya, with ten (10) deaths and fifty three (53) recoveries.

The World Health Organization has provided guidelines on measures that need to be taken to prevent and control the spread of COVID-19. Some of these measures had been or are being implemented in several jurisdictions that have been afflicted by COVID-19. These measures include maintaining social distance; washing hands with soap and water and observing respiratory hygiene.

The provisions of the present Order is to notify the public of the emergence of COVID-19 and the eminent threat posed, in order to prevent and control the spread of COVID-19.

3. Public Consultations

In view of the emergency circumstances occasioned by the rapid spread of COVID-19, and the need to prevent and control the spread of the same, public consultations were not feasible prior to the publication of the Order. It would be appreciated that the measures that the Order seeks to implement are reflective of the necessary executive action that, as a matter of necessity, has to be taken urgently, to prevent and contain the further spread of COVID-19.

It would also be appreciated that the objectives of the present Order would have been undermined if the Order were to be subjected to public participation prior to its publication.

4. Guidance

The Ministry of Health, the Office of the Government Spokesman and the County Governments shall sensitize members of the public on the provisions and requirements of the present Order.
